



Daytona State College Career Exploration Camps Summer 2018

Summer Career Exploration Camps, funded by the Carl D. Perkins grant were offered June 11-14 and June 18-21, to students who are permanent residents of Volusia and Flagler County who are attending a Volusia or Flagler County school entering the 9-12 grades for fall 2018. The two-week camp exposed students to Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs at Daytona State College. CTE programs are Associate of Science and Certificate programs.



Students attended twelve camps at four different locations that included the Daytona Campus, The News Journal Center, the Advanced Technology College and the Volusia County Sheriff's Office Training Center. Volusia and Flagler County Schools provided transportation from four DSC campuses for the 347 students who participated in the summer camps.

Students selected from camps focusing on a multitude of industries, including Architecture, 3D Modeling, Computer Hardware, Construction, Cosmetology, Culinary, Environmental Science, Emergency Services, Machining, Music Production, Photography and Science. Students were able to select one camp the first week and a different camp the second week.



Camp management was provided by the Perkins Project Director and the TRIO Talent Search Staff. Additional personnel included 25 Instructors, 6 Perkins Funded Employees, 5 Student Assistants, 2 Volunteers and several college support staff.
